Recommendations

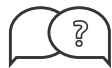


Separate scientific advice from interests, beliefs or opinions through dialogue and agreements
Scientists and policy makers should engage early and regularly



Consider all good science, disciplines and multidisciplinary expertise
Ensure rigorous expert consultation and evidence synthesis

be comprehensive, transparent, iterative



Refine the approach to conflicts of interests
Develop a single code of good practice advising the Commission

Analyse, assess and communicate **uncertainties** more effectively
